Opening DoorsDomestic Violence
and Sexting



Opening Doors is a unique, immersive theatre in education program for students in Years 9 - 12, which combines the power of live performance with robust discussion to educate and empower young people to engage in healthy, respectful relationships. The program consists of a 45-minute performance presented by young professional actors, and a discussion panel with representatives from local police, legal support and other service providers, connecting young people in a tangible way to avenues of support.

Opening Doors is an innovative approach to whole stage wellbeing strategies addressing domestic violence and sexting to work towards respectful relationships.

Duration: 90 minutes

Suggested Year Range:

Years 9 - 12

Cost: \$10 - \$30 per student (min \$3000 + GST up to 300 students)*

*For disadvantaged schools with a demonstrated need for the program, Tantrum offers *Opening Doors* free or at a subsidised rate (when funding is available).

Afternoon Drama + Performance Workshops

Our weekly afternoon Drama + Performance workshops invite young people from diverse backgrounds with unique interests to come as they are. Some love performing and want to pursue a professional career. Some consider themselves artistic in a different way, while others don't at all. Open to anyone aged between 5 and 21, Tantrum's workshops provide a fun and safe space for young people to make 'noise', while empowering them to be creative, kind and themselves.

Tantrum X Ensemble

Tantrum X Ensemble is for members of our Tribe ready to ask questions and listen carefully, connect with new ideas and people, and collaborate with each other as artists to create and present brand new contemporary performance. Tantrum X Ensemble is for returning participants aged between 12 and 18 and runs as an additional weekly workshop alongside our afternoon program. Each project is framed by the making of a new creative work – including our BIG project each year out in the community – that playfully challenges participants' skills and preconceptions about what theatre can be.

Trajectory

Tantrum is a hub for local emerging artists who want to carve out their own sustainable arts practice within our region. Our Trajectory initiative supports emerging artists aged 18 - 26 years or within their first 5 years of professional practice to develop skills, build networks and make bold new performance.

Trajectory Ensemble is an annual program of professional development for emerging artists interested in collaborative, process-driven performance making. Each year, the project is facilitated by a professional artist to create and present a daring new performance work. The Ensemble is open to artists aged 18 - 26. Many previous Ensemble members have been fresh out of high school, keen to explore and develop skills towards a career in the performing arts. School shows of Ensemble outcomes are a great opportunity for young people to see what is possible as a next step after studying Drama in school, or as inspiration for students beginning group projects in Stage 6.

Trajectory Residency is an annual program providing space, mentoring and technical support to selected emerging artists or groups for the creative development of their own new performance work. It's the perfect opportunity to test and refine ideas, seek feedback and engage in the rigorous process of developing a new work, all with the support of Newcastle's leading professional youth arts organisation. The Residency program is the next step in a supported journey towards a professional career in the performing arts.
