Position Title: Associate Artist

Purpose of Position: To undertake an artistic residency with Tantrum, developing new work for a first showing; to co-produce the SCRATCH PAD event; to provide administrative and producing support to Tantrum's operations and programs, and workshop delivery support.

Key Duties and Responsibilities

Project Planning and Coordination (50% of workload)

- Plan and coordinate the delivery of a performance event showcasing experimental new work.
- Coordinate artist call out and selection process for the event.
- Coordinate event logistics, venues and partners.
- Collaborate with Marketing Coordinator to coordinate marketing and promotions for the event.

Programs Support (25% of workload)

- Assist with administrative and producing tasks to support the delivery of Tantrum's programs.
- Assist with the delivery of Tantrum's workshop programs (after-school, school holidays and in-schools).

Creative Development (25% of workload)

- Undertake creative development of own artistic project with the support of Tantrum.
