When the workshop starts, we sit or stand in a circle for our check-in. We share what we would like to be called and then we start to warm up!



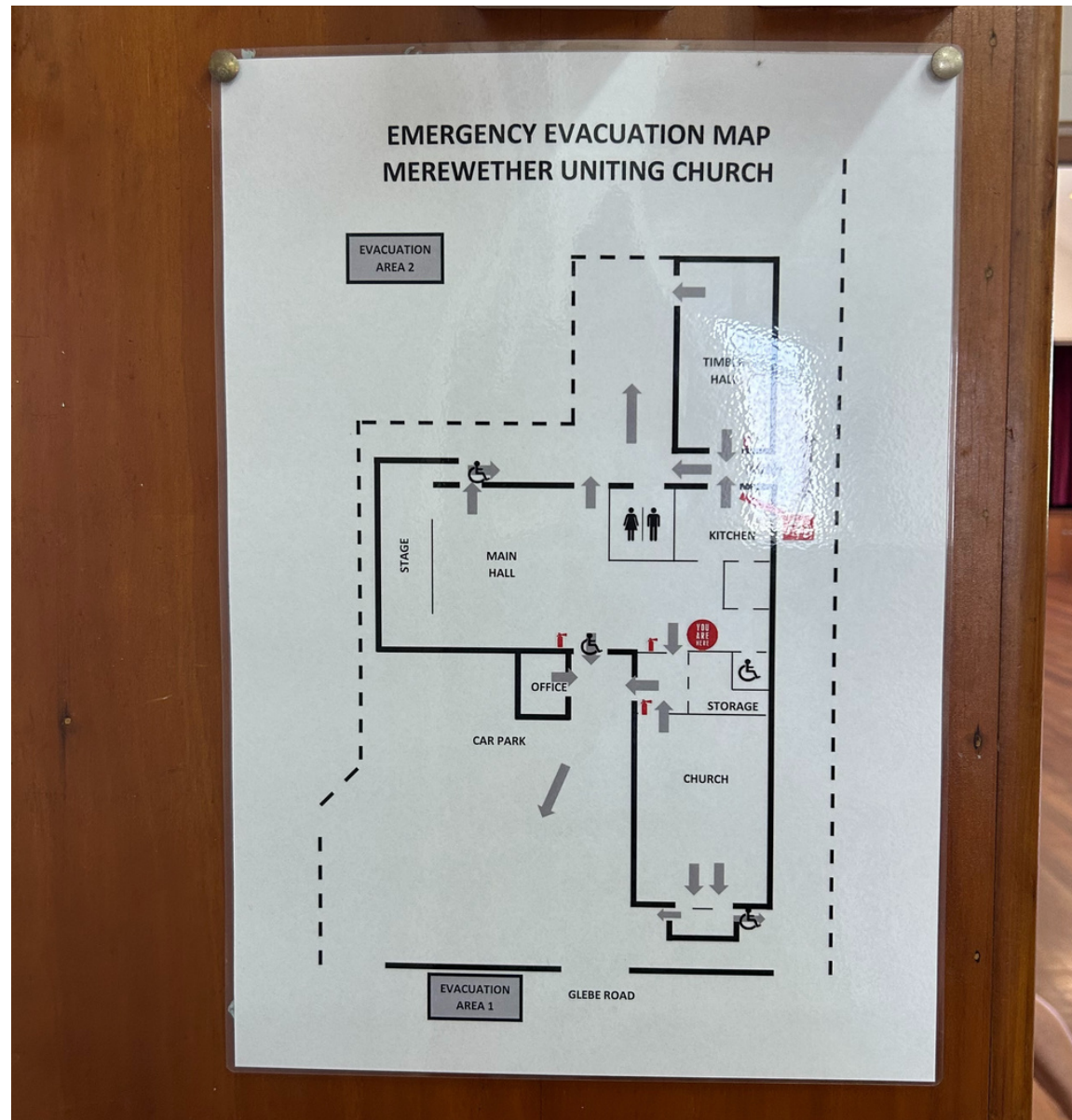
During our workshops, we do lots of different activities. Sometimes we sit down and do a quiet activity and other times we are loud and are up making shapes with our bodies.



There is a bathroom with an accessible toilet. I can tell my teacher if I need to use the bathroom during the workshop.



If I need a drink of water during my workshop I can let the teacher know and they will fill up my drink bottle or bring me a cup from the kitchen. Students are not allowed in the kitchen.



If there's an emergency or we need to evacuate the building, the teacher will tell me what to do. I can also see the evacuation plan on the wall in the hall.



At the end of workshops, we either sit or stand in a circle do our checkout which is a chance to say what we enjoyed in the workshop and say our goodbyes.



When we finish, the teacher will take everyone outside to wait for their parents or guardians. The teacher will stay until everyone is picked up.
